The tomb and effigy of William Canynges the Younger, five times Mayor,
2. The renovated St John's Chapel, containing the new 'boat' altar and a 2. C16th statue of Queen Elizabeth I. Also look out for Cabot's whalebone!

1. Medieval octagonal stone font with carved angel, a suspended

10. Look up to see the journey of faith symbolised in the many decorative ceiling bosses. Each one unique!

11. Heights of heaven
